GREATER TORONTO TENPIN BOWLING ASSOCIATION YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP FUND BY-LAWS

- 1. Must be a CTF member sanctioned through the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association of the CTF.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating high school student in order to apply for the scholarship.
- 3. Applicant must have bowled a minimum of fifty-one (51) games in the current season.
- 4. Applicant must complete all applications in full. Forms are available through the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association office.
- 5. If a scholarship is awarded and the applicant will not be attending a higher level of education, the allotted monies will be returned to the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association Scholarship fund. Returned funds may/may not be re-allocated that season.
- 6. Scholarships will be awarded at the discretion of the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association Scholarship Fund Committee. Scholarships are not necessarily awarded each year.
- 7. No monies will be issued directly to the applicant. Monies will be sent directly to the institute of their choice in the name of the applicant. Funds no used by the expiry date will be returned to the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association Scholarship Fund for future awards.
- 8. Each scholarship shall be for \$250.00 unless otherwise specified.
- 9. The applicant will waive the right for the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association to use their names as advertising and promotion of the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association Scholarship Fund.
- 10. All applications and information contained within the applications will become the sole property of the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association Scholarship Fund.
- 11. All applications will be held in strict confidence by the Greater Toronto Tenpin Bowling Association Scholarship Fund.
- 12. Monies will be held in trust for five (5) years after graduation from Secondary School. The exact date will be specified on the Scholarship Certificate. No exceptions will be made to extend the time period.
- 13. Scholarships will be awarded to the applicant(s) provided that he/she attains a minimum grade average that is acceptable at an approved institute of higher learning.
- 14. All decisions made by the scholarship committee are final and cannot be appealed.
